



NIGMS Gives Coriell \$27M for Repository

On January 25, 2010, GenomeWeb covered the \$27 million, five-year NIH award Coriell received to house the National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS) Human Genetic Cell Repository.

As a result of this exciting award, Coriell will have the opportunity to expand the repository collection through the addition of induced pluripotent stem (iPS) cells – cells produced by genetically reprogramming specialized cell types, like skin cells.

The article also reports that the repository will soon begin meeting custom orders, including panels of RNA samples, or cells grown under specific conditions.
