



Coriell Cites Record of Innovation in Securing \$27M NIH Grant

On January 26, 2010, Shankar P. of NJBIZ interviewed Dr. Michael Christman, Ph.D., president and CEO of the Coriell Institute, regarding Coriell's receipt of a five-year, \$27 million NIH/NIGMS contract.

As reported in the article, Coriell was selected over several other national competitors to receive the award, which will allow the Institute to add a powerful new technology known as induced pluripotent stem (iPS) cells to the National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS)' Human Genetic Cell Repository.

"The idea is new and allows one to take a cell line and turn that into any cell type in the body," Dr. Christman is quoted as stating in the article. "That broadens the scope of research tremendously."
